**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF CONTROL FOR EXAMINATION AND
PROMOTION HELD ON 29/05/2026**

A meeting of the Board of Control for Examination and Promotion was held on 29/05/2026 at 16:30 hrs. in the DGP'S Conference Hall at Bhabani Bhaban, Kolkata-27.

Shri Ajoy Kumar, IPS, Director General & Inspector General of Police (HQs), West Bengal & holding additional charge of Additional Director General & Inspector General of Police (Administration), West Bengal, Chairman of the Board, presided over the meeting.

The following members of the Board attended the meeting:-

1. Shri Rishikesh Meena, IPS, Inspector General of Police, Provisioning, West Bengal & holding additional charge of Inspector General of Police, Organisation, West Bengal.
2. Shri Anoop Jaiswal, IPS, Inspector General of Police, CID, West Bengal (Co-opted Member).
3. Smt. Krishnakali Lahiri, IPS, Deputy Inspector General of Police (Planning & Welfare), West Bengal.
4. Shri Arindam Dutta Chowdhury, IPS, Deputy Inspector General of Police (Administration), West Bengal.
5. Shri Dipanjan De, Sr. Deputy Secretary to the Govt. of West Bengal, Home and Hill Affairs Department.

The following points were discussed in the meeting of BOC for Examination & Promotion.

1. To examine Length-Cum-Record of Service of 37(thirty seven) Wireless Operators for promotion to the rank of Supervisor (Operational) Grade-II in West Bengal Police Telecommunication Branch.

- DIG, Telecommunication, WB in the rank of IGP has sent Memo No. 434/P dated 09/03/2026 enclosing the Minutes of the meeting of WBP Telecommunication Range Board held on 09/03/2026 and Broad Sheet containing 37(thirty seven) Wireless Operators for promotion to the rank of Supervisor (Operational) Grade-II in West Bengal Police Telecommunication Branch.
- The Range Board declared that 35 (thirty five) Wireless Operators are 'Willing' for promotion to their next higher rank and 02(two) Wireless Operators are 'Unwilling' for promotion.
- It is also stated that, out of 35 candidates, W/opr. Sandipan Biswas declared 'Unfit' by the Telecommunication Range Board held on 09/03/2026 due to pendency of criminal proceedings against him. The promotion of W/Opr. Sandipan Biswas had already been kept under '**Closed Cover**' as decided by the BOC(E&P) held on 16/10/2025 and the vacancy against the said 'Closed Cover' candidate has already been kept reserved.
- There are 04 (four) vacancies in the rank of Supervisor (Operational) Grade-II in West Bengal Police Telecommunication Branch as on 09/03/2026. Subsequently, DIG, Telecom, WB, vide his letter Memo No. 927/P dated 15/05/2026, has intimated that, presently the vacancy in the rank of SR(O)-II has increased to 21 (04+17) after awarding promotion of 17 nos. SR(O)-II to the rank of SR(O)-I. It has also been stated that, according to 50-Point Roster of Supervisor(Operational) Grade-II the last vacancy i.e. 30th Vacancy(Unreserved) of 50-Point Roster (9th Cycle) was filled up during the last round of Promotion and the vacancy will be filled up from 31st Vacancy(Unreserved) of 50-Point Roster (9th Cycle) of Supervisor(Operational) Grade-II.

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- The L-C-R-S has been placed before the 'Board of Control for Examination and Promotion for perusal and approval.

DECISION: The BOC (E&P) examined the L-C-R-S of all the 37(thirty seven) Wireless Operators as considered by the WBP Telecommunication Range Board held on 09/03/2026 for promotion to the rank of Supervisor (Operational) Grade-II in West Bengal Police Telecommunication Branch received under Memo No. 434/P dated 09/03/2026 of DIG, Telecommunication, West Bengal in the rank of IGP and intimation letter vide Memo No. 927/P dated 15/05/2026 of DIG, Telecom, WB regarding increase of vacancy and approved the same for the next course of action.

The promotional vacancy of W/opr. Sandipan Biswas had already been kept under '**Closed Cover**' as decided by the BOC(E&P) held on 16/10/2025. However, W/opr. Sandipan Biswas is willing (Broad Sheet Sl. No. 20) in this instant promotional procedure and declared 'Unfit' by the Telecommunication Range Board held on 09/03/2026 due to pendency of criminal proceedings viz. Kotwali PS Case No. 933/23 dated 28/09/2023 u/s 498A/420/406/34 IPC (next date of hearing is fixed on 07/05/2027 before the Court of Ld. J.M. 2nd Court Krishnanagar) and Dhubulia PS Case No. 44/23 dated 07/02/2023 u/s 498A/323/325/34 IPC & 3/4 D.P Act (next date of hearing is fixed on 15/06/2026 before the Court of Ld. J.M. 5th Court, Krishnanagar) against him.

Hence, promotion of W/opr. Sandipan Biswas (Broad Sheet Sl. No. 20) may be kept again in '**Closed Cover**' till disposal of criminal proceedings pending against him, subject to filling up of vacancies in the rank of Supervisor(Operational) Grade-II considering his seniority and comes within the zone of consideration for promotion as per the requirement of 50-point roster.

W/opr. Mustafizur Rahaman (Broad Sheet Sl. No. 11) declared 'Fit' for promotion as per L-C-R-S but one criminal case viz. Jalpaiguri Women PS Case No. 93/16 dated 26/06/2016 u/s 498A/307 IPC r/w Sec. 3/4 of D.P Act is pending against him in the court of Ld. CJM, Sadar Court, Jalpaiguri and the next date of hearing has been fixed on 01/07/2026.

Hence, W/opr. Mustafizur Rahaman may be considered for ad-hoc promotion to the rank of Supervisor (Operational) Grade-II on an officiating basis, subject to the final outcome of the case pending against him and availability of vacancies in the rank of Supervisor (Operational) Grade-II, considering his seniority and comes within the zone of consideration for promotion as per the requirement of 50-point roster.

Therefore, the members of the BOC (E&P) unanimously decided that promotion of all 'Fit' & willing Wireless Operators to the rank of Supervisor (Operational) Grade-II may be accorded, subject to availability of vacancies and observance of all formalities, maintaining the inter-se-seniority of the candidates as per the West Bengal Services (Determination of Seniority) Rules, 1981 and existing rules of 50-Point Roster.

NOTIFICATION

No. 945-BCW/MR-23/2026, dated the 18th May, 2026— WHEREAS, the Hon'ble Division Bench of High Court at Calcutta passed a Judgement/Order on 22nd May, 2024, in the matter of WPO 60 of 2011 with WPA 22145 of 2010 with WPA 8844 of 2020 with WPO 1160 of 2013 with WPO 578 of 2012, wherein the 66 (sixty-six) classes included in the State List of OBC's prior to 2010 for the purpose of availing reservation under article 16(4) of the Constitution of India, were not interfered and distribution of percentage of reservation as 10% for OBC (Category A) and 7% for OBC (Category B) were struck down;

AND WHEREAS, the Hon'ble Division Bench of High Court at Calcutta also limited the reservation for OBCs in the state to 7% for the 66 classes in the State List of OBCs unaffected classes;

NOW THEREFORE, the Governor is pleased to inform accordingly that the State List of OBCs consists of the following sixty-six (66) classes to avail 7% reservation in the services and posts under the Governemnt of West Bengal:-

Police Order No 09 of 2026

Dt. 23.06. 2026

Sub. : Establishment of Cyber Help Desk in every Police Station.

In view of the increasing incidence of cybercrime and the need for prompt assistance to victims at the Police Station level, it is hereby ordered that a Cyber Help Desk shall be established in every Police Station under West Bengal Police.

The Cyber Help Desk shall function as the first point of contact for all cybercrime-related complaints and shall ensure immediate response, particularly in cyber financial fraud cases where action during the 'golden hour' is critical for transaction hold/freezing.

All Commissioners of Police and Superintendents of Police shall establish and operationalize a Cyber Help Desk in every Police Station on a 24 X 7 basis. The Help Desk shall be manned by adequate manpower earmarked by the respective CP/SP and deployed on rotational duty.

The Cyber Help Desk shall receive cybercrime complaints, facilitate reporting through the National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal and Cyber Fraud Helpline 1930, coordinate with banks and payment intermediaries for transaction hold/freezing, collect and preserve preliminary digital evidence, provide guidance to victims, and maintain close coordination with District Cyber Cells, Cyber Police Stations and the West Bengal Cyber Crime Wing.

In cases involving women and children, cyber stalking, online harassment, sexually explicit content, morphing, impersonation, child sexual abuse material (CSAM) or other objectionable online content, the Cyber Help Desk shall take immediate steps for reporting, content takedown/removal through appropriate legal and platform mechanisms, provide assistance to victims, and ensure prompt referral to the competent investigating unit.

Upon receipt of a complaint, the Cyber Help Desk shall immediately assess the nature of the offence, report cyber financial fraud cases through 1930 without delay, preserve digital evidence, ensure registration of FIR wherever required by law, and forward the matter to the competent investigating unit.

CPs/SPs shall provide the necessary infrastructure for establishment and functioning of the Cyber Help Desk and shall personally monitor its effective functioning. Zonal ADGs/IGPs and Range IGPs/DIGs shall supervise and review implementation within their respective jurisdictions.

POLICE ORDER NO. 10

DATED 24.06.2026

Subject : Establishment of Women Help Desk in every Police Station.

In order to ensure swift, empathetic, and specialized assistance for women seeking legal redress, it is hereby ordered that a dedicated 24X7 Women Help Desk shall be established across all police stations in West Bengal. This institutional mechanism aims at making the police stations more women-friendly and approachable by creating a safe, accessible environment that prioritizes women's safety and streamlines the response to gender-based grievances including domestic violence sexual harassment, stalking, human trafficking, child-related concerns, issues related to missing persons and any other crimes against women.

The Women Help Desk shall be the first and single point of contact for any women walking into a police station. The desk shall be manned by adequate number of lady police personnel headed by an officer preferably of the rank of SI, to be deployed on rotational basis.

All Commissioners of Police and Superintendents of Police shall notify a Nodal Officer not below the rank of Deputy Superintendent of Police to coordinate the functioning of Women Help Desks in every police station under their respective jurisdictions.

The Women Help Desk should have a list of local legal experts including the details of DLSA(District Legal Services Authority) officials, details of Protection Officers, psychologists, NGOs and local medical assistance facilities so that those manning the desk can promptly establish contact of the complainant with the concerned authority for referral and facilitation of required support. The desk shall subsequently contact the complainant within 7 days and ascertain the nature of follow-up-action.

A register shall be maintained at the Women Help Desk wherein all complaints shall be recorded Actions taken thereon and the outcome of the follow-up exercise shall also be recorded in the register. With regard to complaints disclosing cognizable offences, the officer in charge of police station shall be immediately informed to initiate FIR registration as per law.

Relevant helpline numbers (Women Helpline: 1091, Emergency Response Support System: 112 and Child Helpline: 1098) shall be prominently displayed at the Help Desk.

All Commissioners of Police and Superintendents of Police shall arrange for periodic training, orientation and sensitization of both women and male police officials working at or in relation to Women Help Desks in police station.

All information received by the Women Help Desk shall remain confidential and shall be disclosed only as required under law or for official investigation purposes.

CsP/SsP shall be responsible for arranging the necessary infrastructural and logistic support for smooth functioning of the Women Help Desks and shall personally monitor the performance of the same. Zonal ADGs/IGPs and Range IGPs/DIGs shall supervise and review effective implementation within their jurisdictions.
